Sheffield Place served 157 families in 2024 New Building will Allow Additional Growth

Sheffield Place launched and completed a \$3.6 million capital campaign, ‘Building for Tomorrow,’ in 2024. Through the campaign, the agency purchased property and began construction of an additional building to serve more families with residential services and increase services for families in the community-based aftercare/outpatient program.

The new building will allow the agency to further tailor services for heightened program effectiveness, which is critical in supporting families in long-term recovery.

Sheffield Place is pleased to share a key 2024 outcome: Of the 76 families that were discharged in 2021, 81% did not re-enter the city-wide homeless services database by the end of 2024. The long-term success of these families demonstrates their resilience, tenacity, and commitment to maintaining self-sufficiency.

SNAPSHOT OF FAMILIES IN 2024

Sheffield Place serves low income families (96% have annual incomes > \$10,000). Mothers have multiple barriers to self-sufficiency:

- 88% had a mental health diagnosis

- 82% had substance abuse disorder

- 63% tested positive for drugs/ alcohol at admission

- 57% had less than a high school/GED education

- 56% had legal issues

- 52% had experienced domestic violence

- 29% had backgrounds in foster care as youth or as runaways

- 23% had at least one felony

Race/Ethnicity: 50% of mothers were White; 32% Black; 18% Mixed other race; 7% Hispanic in ethnicity

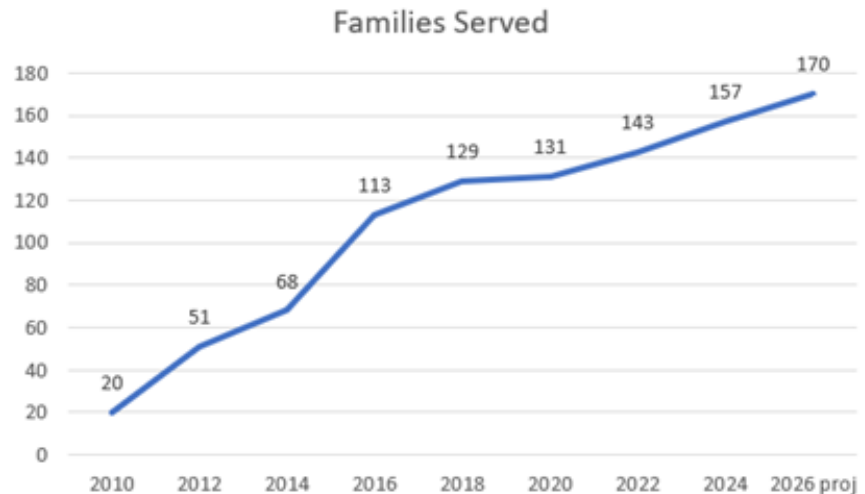
To empower homeless mothers and their children to heal from their trauma and become self-sufficient.

When I first got here, I was cautious and a little leery about the program and hesitant to open up. But now I believe I came to Sheffield for a purpose.

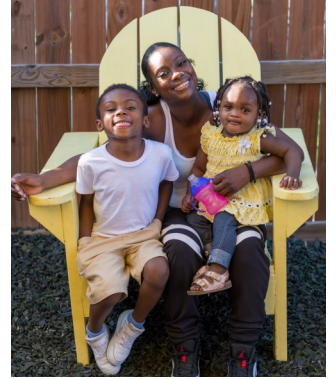

And I am forever grateful for that. This has truly been a humbling experience. And I've gained so much hope for the future.

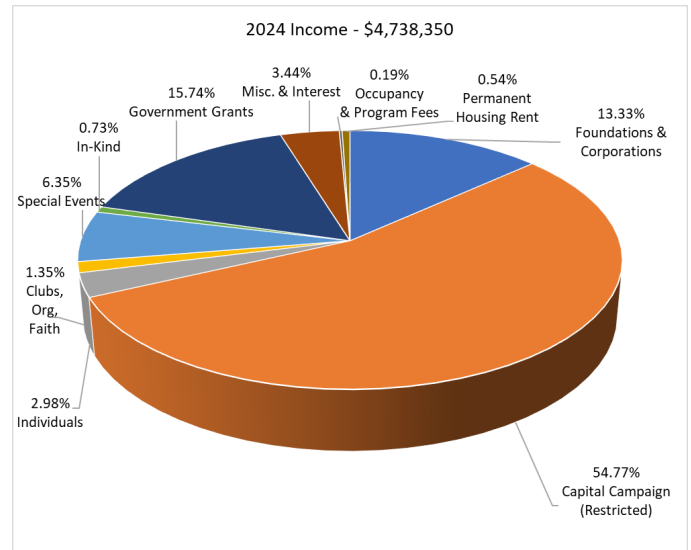
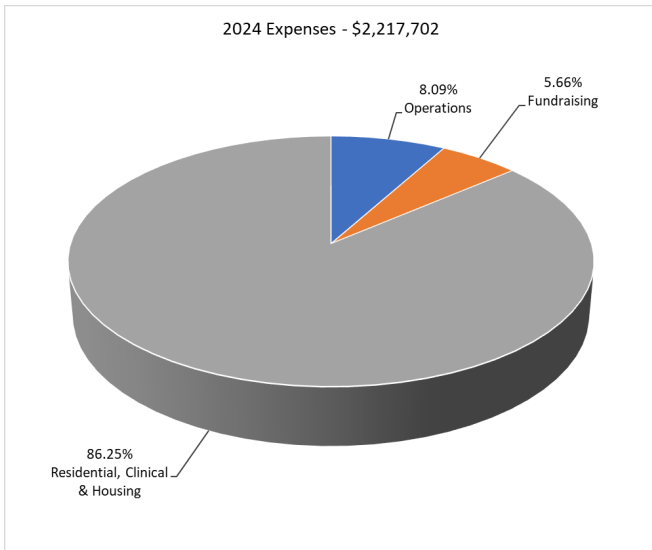

Sheffield Place families benefited from the work of 234 volunteers in 2024. These volunteers contributed 1821 hours of service. The value of the volunteer time is \$56,742.36 based on the Independent Sector's most recent valuation of volunteer in Missouri (\$31.16 per hour).
